

Potential Green Card requirement for policyholders taking their vehicle(s) outside of the UK after 31st October 2019.

In the event of a no-deal Brexit, policyholders will be required to carry a Green Card when travelling outside of the United Kingdom. Here at Ross Gower Group Ltd (RGGL) in conjunction with Markerstudy Insurance Services Limited (MISL) we are taking the necessary steps to ensure we are prepared and minimise the impact to you the policyholder as much as possible.

Green Cards Issued by RGGL

We will require the start and finish date of your trip, together with the countries you are traveling too. Please send to: info@rossgower.com The Green Card will be issued free of charge.

As you will need the original document please allow at least 5 working days for the Green Card to arrive in the post.

Important:

- Green Cards must be physically presented in the country of travel, as a hard copy, and cannot be presented in a digital format or soft copy.
- Only printed original Green Cards will be accepted in the country of travel, not copies of any kind.
- In addition to a Green Card, all drivers will require an International Driver's Permit (IDP) which can be obtained from The Post Office. Without both documents, the vehicle will not be allowed in to the country. Please refer to the following link for further information: https://www.postoffice.co.uk/international-driving-permit
- If a trailer is being used a separate green card is required.
- International Driving Permits (IDP)

What is an IDP?

An International Driving Permit is a legal document that allows the holder to drive a private motor vehicle in any country or jurisdiction which recognises the document.

Do I need an IDP?

An International Driving Permit will need to be carried with a valid domestic driving licence when travelling through certain countries in the EU and EAA from 31st October. An IDP will not be needed to drive in the UK, Ireland, Switzerland, Channel Islands or Isle of Man.
